¹ This enables Clearreview to build a review set that recreates the original reading environment.

² Clearreview can create a set with any number of distractors. More distractors will create a better blind, but of course will take the expert longer to review, increasing costs. We recommend between 4 and 9 distractors, to make review sets between 5 and 10 exams in length.

³ Please enter specific data for each exam alleged to be below the standard of care, including the allegation for the particular exam.

⁴ We ask this because subspecialist reviewers will require a review set that relates to their subspecialty regardless of the original setting of the exam at issue. For example, if a neuroradiologist is going to review a head CT that originated in the ER, the review set will consist of a variety of neuroradiology exams rather than a variety of ER exams, most of which may not be related to neuroradiology.

⁵ Standard of Care scoring prompts the reviewer to assess the radiologist's report as either meeting or not meeting the standard of care, with subscores provided for exams not meeting the standard of care. Impressions Only provides the reviewers with only the clinical information for the exam, and requires the reviewer to enter his/her impressions for each exam. Clearreview's report to you will include the relevant information for your exam(s) of interest. Integrated Review combines these two methods by requiring the reviewer to enter impressions, and only then reveals the original report for scoring.
